Dear Parents,

RE: Thursday 2nd April Primary Update

I hope you are all well.

We always welcome parent feedback, and the changes outlined below are in direct response to ensuring we continue to provide a well-structured, clear and effective learning experience for all of our pupils.

I am writing to share an important update regarding how pupils will access and complete their learning from Sunday 5th April.

To simplify and improve the experience for both pupils and families, we will be moving away from Learning Pages. In their place, all work will now be set through Assignments. This will allow pupils to submit their work directly to their teacher and receive clear, timely feedback, while also providing a more consistent and streamlined approach across all classes.

Alongside this, Class Pages will now be organised by day (Sunday to Thursday). This means parents will only need to access the specific day if learning has been missed, making navigation much simpler. Within each day, you will find:

- Recorded lessons (uploaded after the live session)
- Specialist pre-recorded lessons for that day

To support this transition, Mr Dan has recorded a short video guide for both parents and pupils, explaining how to access, complete and submit work using Assignments. This will be shared with you to ensure everyone feels confident with the new system.

As we begin to phase out Learning Pages, I would also like to remind all families of our expectations around their use. These spaces must be used appropriately at all times. Any misuse—including inappropriate language or accessing accounts that do not belong to the pupil—will result in access being removed. We want to ensure all online spaces remain safe, respectful and purposeful for learning.

In addition, from Sunday, parents will be able to visit the school to collect pupils' workbooks for:

- English
- Maths
- Science

- Humanities

You will also be able to collect Arabic textbooks.

It is important to clarify how these resources will be used. The English, Maths, Science and Humanities books will not contain pre-set tasks. Instead, they are used to record pupils' learning over time, with teachers directing what should be completed in them through Assignments. These books are therefore a key part of your child's learning journey and must be kept safe and in good condition, ready for when we return to school.

Arabic textbooks, however, will continue to be used more traditionally to support structured lesson content and practice.

We are continuing to refine and improve our approach to ensure it works effectively for all of our Capital families. Thank you, as always, for your ongoing support and cooperation.
