As we approach the end of the academic year, we are looking forward to one of the most significant events in our school calendar: the Secondary End of Year Awards Ceremony. This special occasion celebrates not only academic success, but also the commitment and contribution of our pupils to the wider life of the school.

While not every pupil will receive an award, we would like to emphasise that every individual plays an important role in our community, and we are proud of them all.

Today, many of our Key Stage 3 pupils were recognised during assembly for their achievements across a range of areas and criteria. These included the use of online learning platforms such as Dr Frost and Seneca, contributions as Digital Ambassadors, and success in subjects including Drama, Music and Science, alongside recognition for attendance and counselling awards. This reflects our commitment to celebrating success in many forms.

As Year 11 and Year 12 have now completed their examinations and finished for the academic year, and Year 10 pupils are currently completing their assessments, any Year 10 pupils recognised in today's assembly will receive their certificates later this week.

Building on the success of previous years, this year's awards will recognise excellence, effort and engagement across both academic and pastoral areas. Awards presented will include:

- **Scholars Award for Each Subject** – awarded to the pupil with the highest combined assessment results across the year in each subject
- **Form Tutor Award** – one pupil per tutor group, selected for consistently demonstrating a positive contribution to the form community, including:
 - Excellent attendance and punctuality
 - Positive attitude and participation in tutor time
 - Respectful and supportive relationships with peers
 - Consistent demonstration of the school values

The ceremony will take place on **Monday 22nd June, from 1:00pm to 3:00pm, in the Multi-Purpose Hall (MPH).**

To ensure the event remains a meaningful and well-managed occasion, attendance will be by invitation only due to capacity. Families of pupils receiving an award will be contacted directly with full details before the end of the week.
