Curriculum Structure

Core Subjects: English, Mathematics, Science and Arabic are all mandatory at all Key Stages. These subjects are critical for academic development and are assessed through national tests and examinations.

Foundation Subjects: Include ICT, Geography, History, Music and PE. These subjects provide a well-rounded education and help develop a broad range of skills and knowledge.

Personal, Social, Health, and Economic Education (PSHE): Focuses on personal development, well-being, and life skills. This subject covers topics such as health, relationships and financial education.



Curriculum Aims

Breadth and Depth: The National Curriculum aims to provide a broad and balanced education that covers a range of subjects and develops a variety of skills.

Progression: Ensures that pupils build on their prior knowledge and skills as they move through the Key Stages, preparing them for further education or employment.

Equity: Designed to be inclusive and provide equal opportunities for all pupils, regardless of their background or abilities.





Class Teachers will:

- Listen to pupil concerns;
- Try to resolve issues and difficulties;
- Pass on messages and announcements;
- Help with academic and personal problems;
- Make sure that pupils in the class are following the school rules;
- Communicate with parents if there are any problems.

School Council



The School Council is a chance to have an impact on the school and put forward about how we can improve things for all stakeholders.

- Members are voted to stand as representatives of their class.
- The School Council forum (meetings) will be held every fortnight.
- Class representatives will discuss the proposals and put forward their ideas.
- The outcomes of these meetings and discussions will be taken to a meeting of the Senior Leadership Team where they will be discussed.
- The Parliament will then be given feedback and any next steps the school will take.
